Completed	30-Aug-24	T&E	SHR 700000006368 Hwy #1 C05-18 were being transported by a road van (Cab number 2857 Lic plate 290 NGW (sask plate) About 0305 pulled over at Walsh rest stop. Driver was Drifting into the shoulders past rumble strips multiple times. I asked the driver if they were okay and driver kept telling me they were fine. After the final time of the vehicle drifting past the rumble strips I then told the driver to pull over and take a break. The driver did pull over into the Walsh truck stop. To my surprise, instead of getting out to go for a walk or have a smoke or something to wake herself up, driver asked employee if she had enough room to lay their chair back. At this time, employee and I decided to call the Director and Medicine Hat ATM to find alternative transportation for us. This situation happens way more often than not. Without sounding rude, action that is highly recommended is having road drivers who are not falling asleep at the wheel. Either having more experienced drivers or drivers that take fatigue management seriously need to be put into place. Reply: Hallcon has removed the driver involved from driving CPKC crews.

SHR 700000006370 Alyth Resthouse This report is in regards to the interior painting of the Alyth Resthouse that was just completed. Running trades were back to work evening of Aug25th, i was the 4th crew to arrive at the resthouse early AM 26th with the stench of fresh paint fumes & not one window open in either wing of the bunkhouse. Not wanting to stir pot with management as we just came back to work, we opened our windows and went to sleep. I thought work was all done & fumes would gas off after few days, as i awoke on the 26th there is a worker patching walls in our kitchen and boot/locker areas while our guys cook. Aug28th i am back in resthouse again, i awake and the floors of kitchen are covered in freshly sanded patch dust. Halcon resthouse ladies mop it up for us. Aug29th I am on my final tour home & awake and go to cook my food and there is three workers, two painters and one foreman in kitchen painting window frames and kitchen walls while men and woman sit in kitchen, one of them cooking on the stove not 4ft from said painter. Pictures available upon request. This work should not have been completed while our crews were in this rest facility. It should have been bulletined in advance and another place of rest arranged. The communication between Management, Facilities & Halcon Resthouse Staff was a complete failure and is unacceptable. There was no regard for our health. This report is to make record of said event and to prevent this failure from happening again for future projects in our place of rest. (Action Recommended) Do Better. Reply: Painting is complete at the Resthouse. Windows were opened to air out the facility.

This is not an isolated incident as I have conversed with many other engineers that have encountered this issue while switching. It may be an electrical issue or a radio timeout issue. This is a switching hazard as sometimes we will be shoving cars or shoving to a joint and lose contact with the conductor on the movement. No other comments. needs investigation. Reply: A review of the radio tower has been conducted at Calgary Intermodal Facility (Shepard CIF) and the radio tower is working as intended. It may be an issue with the Locomotive radio which will need to be reported to Mechanical and identified with a time, location and locomotive number. Thank you for bringing you concern forward.
